Raymond T. Edmondson Service Awards



Raymond T. Edmondson Service Award

The Raymond T. Edmondson Service Award was established in 2004 to recognize *the decades* of leadership he provided to the Florida Public Pension Trustees Association, and to annually acknowledge a member of the Association who emulates his tireless commitment to protecting the retirement security of Florida's public employees and their retirement systems.



Dwight Mattingly, CPPT

Dwight Mattingly is a strong champion of public workers' rights. Following a back injury in 1996, Dwight left his teaching job and joined the Palm Beach County Public Transit (Palm Tran) after a friend recommended the job partly because of the pension benefit. Soon after, he became a member of the Amalgamated Transit Union where he rose to Financial Secretary, then President/Business Agent, which entailed serving on the pension board. In 2012 he was named Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Palm Tran/ATU 1577. Dwight also serves as Vice Chairman of the Florida Amalgamated Transit Union State Legislative Conference Board. As a member of the ATU 1577 Pension Fund, he has spent the last three years actively lobbying in Tallahassee to protect workers' rights and public pensions. He has been asked to testify before several committees and Senate caucuses.

He joined the FPPTA, earned his CPPT designation, and successfully ran for the Board of Directors in 2012. He is a member of the Education Committee and serves on the By-Laws and Audit Committees. His duties as a union representative means he is keyed into many labor related issues. He works tirelessly to keep the FPPTA informed of proposed and pending legislation that will affect public pensions. He brings a wealth of experience to our Board and the FPPTA is proud to have him as a member.



Warren West, CPPT

Warren West is a member of the Avon Park Firefighters Pension Fund. He has served more than 35-years in fire rescue services. Warren joined the U.S. Air Force in 1978 as a Fire Protection Specialist until he moved to Florida in 1983, when he was hired as a Florida State Park Ranger before resuming his career as a firefighter. He has worked as an Avon Park Firefighter since 1986 and has obtained the rank of captain. In 1988 Warren became a founding member of Avon Park Professional Firefighters Local 3132 where he served as Secretary/Treasurer for several years before becoming President. Warren has served as President of Local 3132 for more than twenty years. In 2003 Warren was elected by the participants to serve as a Board member of the Avon Park Firefighters Pension fund. In 2005 he became the board chairman and has held that position to present day. In January 2008, Warren completed the FPPTA's CPPT program and was appointed to the FPPTA Education Committee in June 2011. He was elected to the FPPTA Board of Directors in 2018. Warren serves on the Election, By-Laws and Executive Oversight Committees. Warren has demonstrated his commitment by extending his involvement with our organization year after year and we are grateful not only for his generosity, but his reliability.




